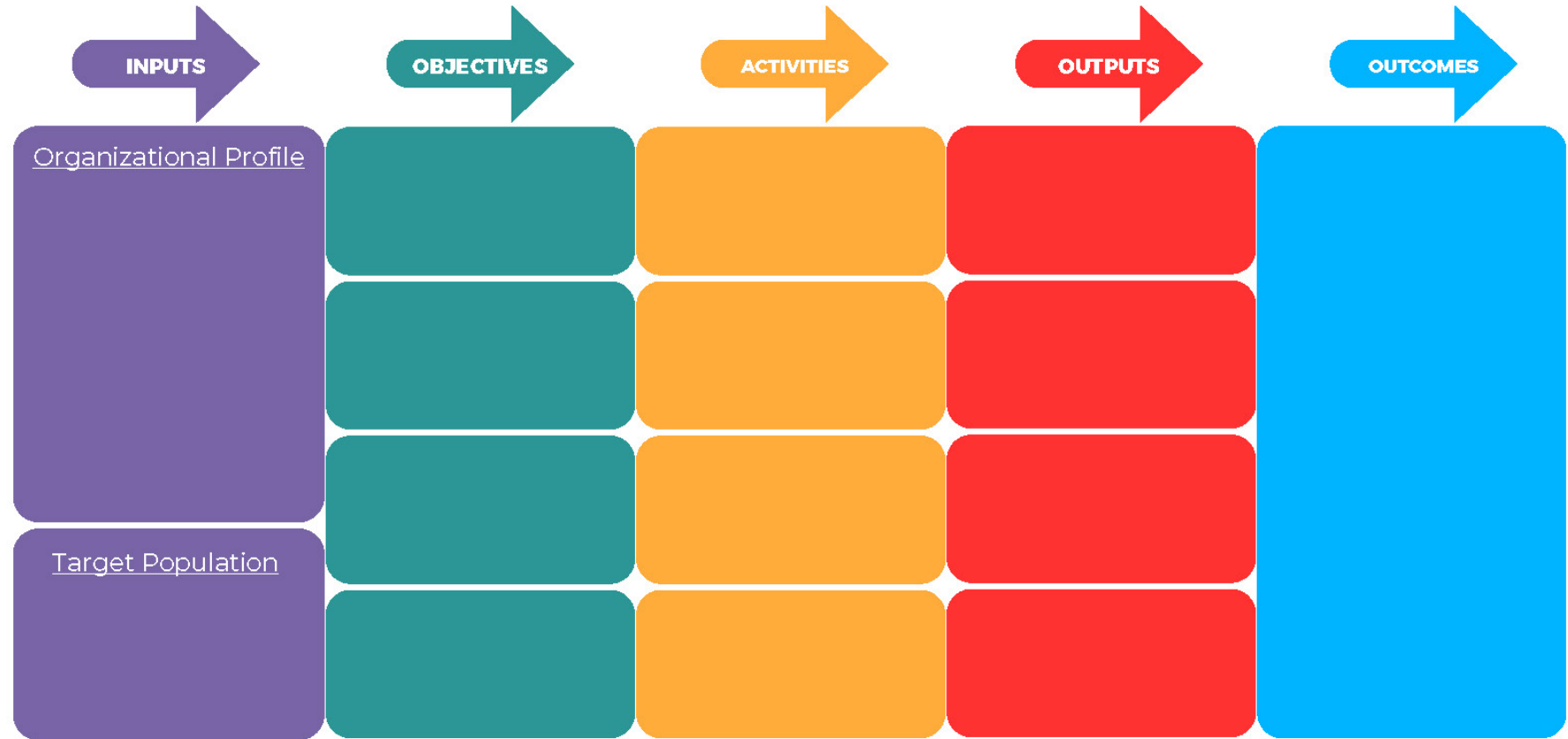

## SITUATION:

Click here to replace this example situation: By 2050, the American Indian/Alaska Native population is estimated to reach 8.6 million people in the U.S. Research indicates that 4 in 5 Native women have experienced violence in their lifetime, well over half have experienced sexual and physical violence by an intimate partner, and over two-thirds have experienced psychological aggression. These high rates of violence continue to erode the fabric of our culture. While there has been great effort to assist victims/survivors and reduce this violence, many barriers and challenges continue to exist.

## ASSUMPTIONS

# Logic Model Project Example

**Program: Justice Program | Goal:** To provide culturally sensitive services to American Indian/Alaska Native victims and increase awareness of teen dating violence

## INPUTS

**Organizational Profile –**  
Justice Program is a non-profit, 501(c)(3)  
Board of Directors - 6 members

**Program Staff –**  
8 full-time, 2 part-time, 3 volunteers

**Budget -** \$500,000

**Target Population**  
American Indian and Alaska Native youth

## OBJECTIVES

1. Develop and deliver an array of services to victims of teen dating violence

2. Coordinate services and strengthen partnerships with local schools and youth organizations

3. Develop and deliver community awareness and public education

## ACTIVITIES

1. Develop and implement a trauma-informed care model & practices;  
2. Provide opportunities for clients to participate in cultural ceremonies/activities.

1. Develop collaboration with local middle/high schools and youth centers;  
2. Formalized MOU's with identified partners;  
3. Create youth task force.

1. Create a prevention campaign;  
2. Host community education and awareness events;  
3. Provide education and awareness to youth.

## OUTPUTS

1. Serve at least 30 youth victims by the end of Year 3;  
2. Provide access to traditional ceremonies and cultural activities for at least 30 youth;  
3. Conduct monthly clinical case consultation and care coordination meetings.

1. Engage in at least 1 meeting each quarter with MOU partners by the end of Year 3;  
2. Engage in at least 1 task force meeting each quarter by the end of Year 3.

1. Create at least 3 prevention campaigns with youth task force;  
2. Engage in at least 6 awareness and education activities by the end of Year 3.

## OUTCOMES

1. Increase identification AI/AN youth victims of teen dating violence;  
2. Increase awareness of teen dating violence and healthy relationships among youth in middle and high schools;  
3. Enhance the skills and practice of staff teen dating violence;  
4. Increase in awareness of teen dating violence among educators and community members;  
5. Increase in participation of youth survivors in cultural ceremonies, classes and activities.

# Logic Models for Evaluations

How does a logic model get incorporated into your program/project evaluation?

The question being – what difference(s) did our program/project make?

- ▶ Is our program/project on the right track, addressing the appropriate issue(s)?
- ▶ Is our program/project engaging in the right tasks to accomplish our goal(s)?
- ▶ What difference has it made to our clients?
- ▶ What difference has it made in our community?
- ▶ What are the barriers/gaps?
- ▶ How can we improve?

Are there limits to what a logic model can accomplish?



# Timeline-

the necessary elements of an effective timeline include:



The lists of tasks to be completed;

The dates on which the tasks need to be completed by;

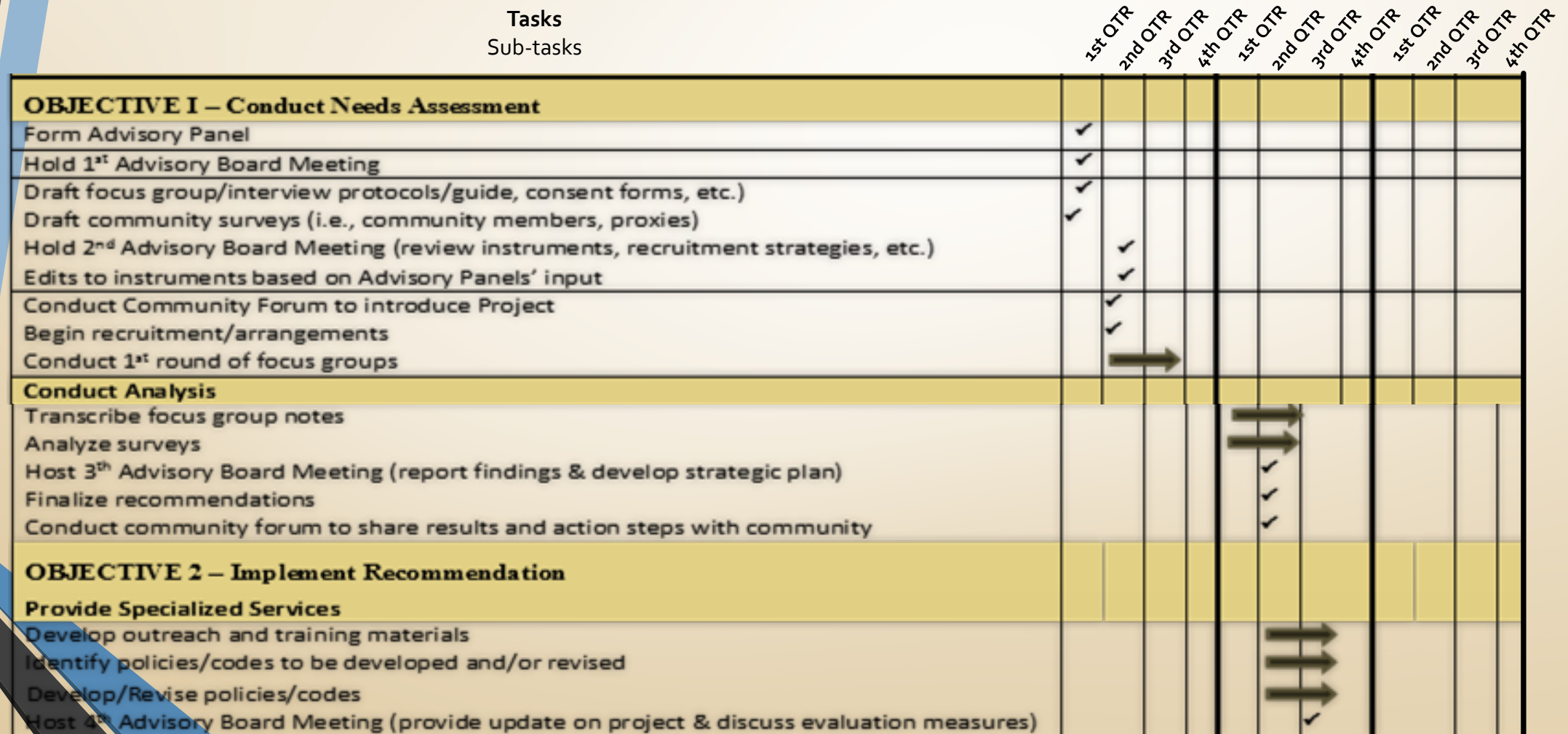
The expected duration of each task (how long will you be working on this task);

Identify which tasks depend on the completion of other tasks.

## Logic Models and Timelines

*Things to remember;* Logic models and timelines are your friends.

Realistically, you will be measuring short-term outcomes.

Be careful not to confuse activities with goals and objectives.

Be realistic with outcomes. They should be linked to your program's goals and objectives, and they should be achievable.

Logic models can be reworked if they aren't working for you.

Timelines are a great visual resource for keeping you on track!
